He commented on the challenges facing the state including the various carbon and climate change strategies, invasives and the associated problems of regeneration, and the continued saga of the Act 250 legislation. Overall the state's forests are in good shape right now.

John Austin gave an interesting and informative briefing on wildlife habitat connectivity and the forest landowner.

John Morton, a trails development and design expert, and the keynote speaker, gave an excellent and instructional presentation on trail development, construction, and maintenance.

Reception:

Later in the afternoon a beautiful photo remembrance of Put's life was presented and many members and friends gave warm and emotional anecdotes of their memories of Put and his long and storied life in Vermont and New Hampshire.

The meeting adjourned at 6 PM.
